SANCTUARY RE-OPENING POSTPONED

Reopening our sanctuary has been postponed until • further notice We will continue our online worship on 700m

At the time of our reopening it will require cooperation and flexibility from all of us. We will not be returning to the same church we left on March 15th. Many guidelines have been laid out for the reopening - guidelines that have been carefully reviewed and prayed about and is consistent with the Florida Conference and the CDC reopening guidelines. Here is a summary and you will • hear much more as times draws near:

- Reservations: We are only accommodating 50 persons in the sanctuary at this time and reservations will be needed. Please call the church • office at (954) 731-2323 or email at office@merrellumc.org. The deadline for reservations, noon Thursday before the Sunday you would like to attend.
- Parking: As you drive up, parking attendants will be outside to guide you.
- Entering the sanctuary: Your temperature will be taken upon entering. No hugs or handshakes.
- Social Distancing: There will be signs giving reminders to maintain social distancing at all times.
- Seating Sanctuary: You will be directed to designated seating areas and invited to sit in pre-arranged settings. Ushers will direct you where praying for the health and wellbeing of all. to sit. Three persons per pew in every other pew. Families will be allowed to sit together.
- Masks are mandatory: For all persons age 2 and Your servant brother in Christ, above, please have on your masks,
- worship: We encourage all online meetings that can be arranged through the church office.

- There will be no sitting choir during worship: The Chancel Choir, other choirs and praise teams will not be in the loft at this time. It is the intention to have singing being led in other ways. You must not take off masks for singing.
- Bring Personal Bibles: All paper products including Bibles and Hymnals will be removed from the pews.
- First Sunday Communion: You may pick up a packaged communion element after entering the entrance of the Sanctuary. Pastor will provide further nstructions as to usage before communion.
- Offering placed in Narthex: Your offering may be placed in the offering boxes in the Narthex when you enter or exit. Envelopes and pens will be available.
- Areas off limits: Balcony, East Lounge, Room 17 and Ragsdale Hall are off limits at this time.
- Exiting the Sanctuary: Ushers will direct you as you exit the sanctuary to the parking lot.

Together we will work to safely do the work of God as good neighbors respect the care for all persons. We will be victorious as we exercise faith over the long term. We will continue to monitor the COVID-19 rate of infections and make adjustments as are necessary. Keep

Bishop's Task Force on Anti-Racism Developments, Opportunity for Study and Conversation

In response to the public deaths of Breonna Taylor, Ahmaud Arbery, George Floyd and Rayshard Brooks, and in support of movements toward conversation and action, Bishop Carter announced the formation of a Bishop's Task Force on Anti-Racism. The task force will include three teams: Training and Accountability; Public Policy and Witness; and Beloved Community. The leadership of these three teams was announced last week. In consultation with the District Superintendents and Dr. Sharon Austin, Director of Connectional and Justice Ministries, and in an open process that included nominations and self-nominations, the following persons will comprise the three teams.

Training and Accountability
Public Policy and Witness
Beloved Community
